Traditional bread kneading in the village bakery called "christopsomo".




The Christmas table includes lamb spit, roasted turkey, festive salads, drinks and desserts.






In New Year's Eve we throw olive leaves in the fireplace and we ask Santa to tell us if somebody loves us.

"Xerotiana" or "loukoumades" are pancakes made with flour, water and sourdough. With these ingredients people make loose dough like porridge. The dough is cut by hand and fried in olive oil. Then honey or sugar is spread on them!

"Skalapountari", according to tradition are demons that appear before "Theofania".

These demons are rumored to be coming out of the Underworld where they live, to tease people and shuffle their houses. On the Eve of the Theofania, people throw the "xerotiana" on the roofs of their houses, so that the demons can eat and leave.

Fota or Theofania (on the 6th of January)

The basic ritual of "Theofania" is the "sanctification of the maters" by diving the Cross in imitation of the Baptism of Jesus Christ. Young people are diving in the cold mater to catch the Cross in order to be blessed during the year.
